## **Notes on Tiger Reserves:**

- \*\* Tiger Reserves (TRs) with a **high density of wildlife tourism** (100,000 <) and/or TRs heavily visited for **religious tourism**.

  It appears that only NAMDAPHA, BUXA, SUNDERBANS & MELGHAT TRs **do not allow tourism in Core Areas**. Of these, only Sunderbans has high tourism in the Buffer Zone.

  A number of TRs have Forest Dept. rest houses and State Tourism **facilities inside Core Areas** (e.g. Manas, Palamau, Bandipur, Bhadra, Periyar, Kanha, Dudhwa and Corbett).

  There are virtually **no private resorts situated inside TR Core Areas**.
- < SIMLIPAL, INDRAVATI, PALAMAU & UDANTI-SITANADI Tiger Reserves are in areas disturbed by insurgents.

Most of the TRs have **public roads (including National Highways)** running through them. These include Corbett (SH 4), Dudhwa, Sariska (two SHs), Indravati (NH 16), Pench MP (NH 7), Pench Maha. (NH 7), Kanha, Bandhavgarh, Tadoba-Andhari, Panna (SH 6), Melghat, Achanakmar, Udanti-Sitanadi, Bandipur, Nagarjunasagar, Palamau, Valmiki, Buxa (NH 31C), Nameri, Dampa and Namdapha. A number of tigers and many other wildlife species have died in accidents on these roads.

TRs that have railway lines running through them include Palamau, Dudhwa, Valmiki and Buxa Tiger Reserves.

- 1 NAGARJUNASAGAR TR is now free from insurgency problems. It has little wildlife tourism but a popular temple inside the TR creates heavy vehicular and foot traffic on a metal road (the road is closed to night traffic). There is also an irrigation township at Sundipenta in the heart of the TR that is expanding rapidly.
- 2 PAKKE TR has negligible tourism. Local people have recently constucted huts outside the Core Area on RF land for limited tourism, in agreement with the Forest Dept.
- 3 BIIGIRI RANGANATHA TEMPLE (BRT) has limited wildlife tourim. Accomodation is provided within Core Area by Jungle Lodges Ltd. (a Karnataka State Govt. enterprise).
- <sup>4</sup> PARAMBIKULAM TR tourism is highly regulated. It caters mainly to those who come to stay at rest houses run by the Forest Dept. and an Eco Development Committee.
- <sup>5</sup> PERIYAR TR has considerable tourism, including lakhs of religious tourists annually to the Sabarimala pilgrimage area.
- SAHAYADRI TR is beset with problems and disturbances, including nearby mining, windmills, lack of enforcement, encroachment, and tree felling in private forests.
- <sup>7</sup> SIMLIPAL TR has minimal wildlife tourism in the Core Area, at Chahala.
- 8 SATKOSIA TR used to have a tented camps inside the Core. Currently tourists are allowed in boats inside the Mahanadi Gorge which is inside the Core Area.
- 9 RANTHAMBHORE & SARISKA TR both have lakhs of religious tourists that annually visit the Ganesh Temple and a temple at Pandupole, respectively.
- ANAMALAI TR tourism is centred mainly around Top Slip. There is Forest Dept. accommodation inside the TR.
- KALAKAD-MUNDANTHURALTR has a small amount of wildlife tourism, mainly on the Mundanthurai side, and pilgrimage pressure due to a temple inside the TR.
